

INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE SPRING 2018 ANNENBERG AUCKLAND, NEW ZEALAND PROGRAM APPLICATION

PLEASE READ THE INSTRUCTIONS VERY CAREFULLY AND COMPLETE ALL SUPPLEMENTAL DOCUMENTS BEFORE YOU BEGIN THIS ELECTRONIC APPLICATION. YOU WILL NOT BE ABLE TO SAVE AND EDIT AT ANOTHER DATE. The following steps need to be completed by 12:00 PM on Tuesday, August 1, 2017 in order to be considered. Late or incomplete applications will NOT be accepted.

STEP 1: Complete the Annenberg International Programs online application, and upload the following documents directly. Online application, here.

Please have your passport information ready as well as emergency contact information for this two-page application. At the end of the online application there will be a message that appears to let you know you have successfully submitted the application.

- ✓ Current Resume: upload PDF entitled LastName FirstName Resume
- ✓ **Photo**: upload professional-looking headshot in JPG format (2inx2in). Entitle LastName_FirstName_Pic
- ✓ **Essay:** <u>Upload one 500-word essay, double spaced that answers the following questions:</u> Single or double spaced with 1-inch margins. Please include your name on all pages.
 - Why do you want to study abroad? Why have you selected New Zealand?
 - Describe your personal interests, previous overseas travel, work experience and volunteer experience.
 - What is the relevance of studying abroad at AUT University in Auckland to your academic major or minor?
 - How will you contribute to the overall success of the Auckland study abroad program?

Please save the document in the format of: LastName_FirstName_Essay

**Keep your essay. You will use it as your personal statement for TEAN (the study abroad provider that administers the program) if accepted by Annenberg International Programs.

STEP 2: Obtain a reference letter from a professor or TA

Obtain a recommendation from a professor or TA:

The recommendation must be completed, sent and submitted online by a professor or TA; unfortunately, a work or internship reference will not be accepted. The recommendation is completed online; you must send your recommender the URL for the recommendation at least two weeks before the application deadline. The reference's contact information as well as their job title are required; if any of this information is missing, we will contact the reference for verification.

STEP 3: Conditional admission + TEAN application

After applications are reviewed by Annenberg International Programs, students who are conditionally accepted to the program will receive notification from our office with an invitation to the online TEAN/AUT application as well as instructions for that application. Notifications will be sent out by the end of September. Please check your USC email for these notifications.

Continuing Registration:	Students should consult with their academic advisor to determine which courses they should take upon return to USC. If specific courses are essential, please arrange for an advisor to clear enrollment for these courses.
Course Changes:	If any course changes occur after the original Advising Record has been signed, students need to obtain written or electronic approval from an undergraduate academic advisor.
Courses	Please see the following page for details.
Grades:	Students will receive letter grades on the AUT transcript. These grades will be articulated at USC on a Credit/No Credit basis. Students must receive a C- or higher at AUT to receive credit.
Full-time Course load:	Students are required to take 16 units (typically 4 classes, one of which relates to New Zealand culture/civilization.
Course Credit:	Students may earn the maximum of 16 USC units per semester. COMM students typically earn 4-12 COMM units. JOUR/PR students will earn 8 units of JOUR elective units, plus 8 general elective units in the courses of their choice.
Academic Requirement:	Minimum cumulative 3.0 USC GPA, sophomore standing or higher, and have completed at least one year of course work at USC by the start of the program.

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COMM MAJORS

AUT University Courses Approved for Upper-Division COMM Major Credit

The following courses have been approved for upper-division COMM major credit. ALL OTHER courses you are allowed to register for at AUT will come back to USC as general elective credit as long as those courses have equivalents at USC. (For example, Fashion Design 101 at AUT will not come back for credit at USC because there is no Fashion Design department at USC.) Those may also be applicable to a second major or minor (if you have one), so you should seek the permission of your advisor in that department.

Please note that 12 upper-division COMM units (3 AUT courses) cannot be guaranteed every semester that the program is offered.
